It's that time of year again! The Friends of the Bowlus, Inc.'s annual membership drive is in full-swing. For those of you who aren't familiar with the Friends organization, we are a 501(c)3 not-for-profit whose mission is simple:

To support the bricks and mortar and operations of the Bowlus Fine Arts & Cultural Center.

We know that you appreciate what the Bowlus Fine Arts & Cultural Center has to offer our community through your past membership with the Friends, attendance at Bowlus events, and other support that you have shown in recent years. We THANK YOU and would like to officially INVITE YOU to join us in becoming a Friend of the Bowlus for the 2018-2019 membership year! Annual membership fees are only \$35 for an individual or household membership and \$50 for a business membership.

The new east addition and fine arts plaza is finally a reality!

This beautiful and much needed addition is not only a valuable and visibly striking enhancement to the Bowlus, but also a gift to the community by providing handicapped accessible parking, an elevator, and other features that allow improved accessibility for the elderly and others who have difficulty walking far distances or climbing stairs. As of May 31, 2017 (Just for fun!):

*A gift of \$100,000 received from Mickey Lynn is permanently endowed with only the interest and dividend earnings being available for payment on project related expenses.

Between June 1 - June 15, \$4,000 was transferred from the Lynn Family Gift to the Cash (CNB&T) account and additional gifts of \$1,030 were received and deposited.

Checks were written in the amount of \$21,735.68.

PROJECT NEARLY COMPLETE

The decorative wall (which is nearly identical to the design of the former portico wall) screens the view from the east entry doors.



Forms were built for the unique sidewalk layout prior to pouring the concrete. This was the first time that we could really get a feel for the scale and design of the plaza area.










The accessible parking spaces and circle drive with easy no-stairs access to the east lobby will be a huge asset for many Bowlus patrons. The generous paved area provides a space for outdoor gathering and may someday include a few tables and chairs for an outdoor eating space.

TLC Garden Center has been working hard to get the irrigation system installed, dirt moved, trees planted, and sod laid before the grand opening event at the end of the month.
